Harry D. Redding, Jr., 82, of Churchtown, passed away Friday, June 14, 2013 at his residence.

Born September 20, 1930 in Pine Plains, he was the son of the late Florence and Harry D. Redding, Sr.

Harry served in the US Navy during the Korean War on the Aircraft Carrier USS LEYTE (CV-32), where he earned the National Defense Service Medal and the Navy Occupation Service Medal with European Clasp. He was a self-employed carpenter and well known for his master carpentry skills. In his spare time he built model planes and dollhouses. He also delivered meals to senior citizens for the Meals on Wheels Program.

Harry was the beloved husband of the late Frances (Belcher) Redding. He was also predeceased by his brother, Robert, and his son, William.
