“ 8/15/2024 - Just got off the 'phone with Carole Faber who told me about Alex's passing. God rest his soul.

Worked for Alex Lindsay in the 1990's, a fascinating job and company, with more variety and interesting people than imaginable. Modern Arts Packaging, Lindsay Gray's Bistro, Mrs. Lindsay's (Joy's) Expo Travel Agency, Real Estate, Contracting - Never a dull moment. Alex had a larger-than-life personality, and he brought style and artistic flare to packaging. Alex contributed broadly to change in a dull industry - counting Paloma Picasso as a client among many other famous luxury brands, the Metropolitan Museum was a client. Alex was at times tough, but usually fair, he challenged and pushed one to be better. New York City bureaucracy wouldn't allow a banner for the restaurant - Alex wouldn't take no for an answer. Alex wanted trees planted in front of the building, to this day two gingko trees bring a smile when passing by 38 West 39th Street. Alex generously contributed gift bags to a charity event my family hosted annually at The Waldorf. Alex was surprising at times with myriad abilities, even taking over for the chef in the restaurant during the lunch rush in a pinch. Lindsay Gray's was the only decent after work place for a drink in the Garment District at that time. Alex had energy like no one and an eye for detail that missed nothing. You had to be canny around him, but he appreciated loyalty. He had a sense of humor and wore a hunting hat around the office at Christmas time on the day of my Secret Santa gift. I can honestly say I will never forget him. Our connection at interview was through Bard College, which coincidentally we had both attended, though years apart, and just as coincidentally my close school friends in New York were sisters to his Bard roommate. I'd see him at the Annual Bard Christmas parties and introduce him as my boss, Alex would scold - "Don't say that!" Years later am still in touch with co-workers from that time, a testimony to the close type of atmosphere Alex fostered. John, Carole, Mindy, Debbie, Margie, "Q" - Quirino, Chaman Lal (a/k/a Paul), Leona, Florence(s) and Sabastian (the alley cat) - all remembered with a smile.
