Bernice (Bronislaw) Pugliese passed away peacefully on January 23, 2024.

Her real birth name, Bronislaw, is derived from the Polish word for armor, strength, and protection. Perhaps that's why she always exemplified a graceful strength. To her family and friends, Bernice was a steady and supportive figure in their lives.

She was born in Elizaville, NY on April 26, 1931 to Polish/Ukrainian immigrants Steven and Anya Himmel. Bernice was raised on a number of farms throughout Columbia County and graduated from Hudson High School. In 1949 she married Peter Mixa, with whom she had four children. Bernice owned and operated Helene's beauty parlor on Warren Street for well over two decades. Working on her feet by day, caring for four children at night, Bernice was a working mom and successful entrepreneur—long before that was common. Later in life, she remarried Albert Pugliese. When not traveling the world, they spent many happy years in Craryville, NY and South Florida. Bernice liked to dress well and keep others well-fed. She liked her brandy cold and her house warm. She wasn't one to speak badly of others. She was a shopper: clothing, gifts for family and friends, and jewelry. She was a reader: history books, novels, and cookbooks. In April, Bernice would have been 93 and her family would have gathered to eat pierogies, enjoy libation, and toast the woman whose strength protected and connected her family.

Bernice was predeceased by her three brothers, Stanley Himmel, Raymond Himmel and Steven Himmel.

Bernice is survived by her four children, Patricia Mixa Cohen (Myron), Pamela Mixa Cranna, Paula Mixa Millar, and Peter Mixa (Karen Roberts); her six grandchildren, Brendan (Lauren) Cranna, Seth (Amanda) Florio, McCaily Cranna (Ari Raleigh), Kaila Womac, Spencer Rickborn and Kirstyn Mixa Yancy (Payton) her sister Elizabeth Pazera, sister-in-laws Joan Himmel and Julie Himmel; as well as her six great-grandchildren.
