Boyd Schaumann passed away September 8, peacefully on his 85th birthday in the loving arms of his family at his home in Mellenville, set on the farm hills he roamed as a boy so long ago.

He dearly loved his wife Sylvia. They met at a Fire Department barbecue and were happily married for sixty years. They were together for so many wonderful days, starting with hot coffee in the morning, then adventures, work or family activities, followed by a single Genesee beer and a warm fire in the evening.

Boyd enjoyed horseshoes, golf and softball in his younger days. He pitched softball for many years under the Chatham lights and with the Davis boys all over Columbia County.

Boyd thrived in the quiet simplicity of his wooded surroundings. He cut many cords of wood with his 1910 Sears & Roebuck saw rig, a machine he salvaged from his father's farm.

In the summer, the Mets were his passion since 1962. Sylvia and Boyd would sit together and listen to games on the radio. Mostly clapping and groaning except for the wonderful years of 1969 and 1986. In the fall, he enjoyed the Patriots football team and their many superbowl rings. His pond-sized banner

drawn in the snow even made a national newspaper one cold January day before another big victory.

Boyd should be remembered with these five simple virtues: He served his country; he worked hard; he loved his family; he was nice to everyone and he laughed with all.

He will be forever loved by his wife Sylvia (Engel) Schaumann of Claverack, daughter and son in law PeggySue and Chris Boyle of West Sand Lake, son and daughter in law Daniel and Ann Schaumann of East Nassau, grandchildren Tyler, Evan, and Sarah Boyle, Rebekah and Erik Schaumann. He is also survived by his sister in law Ruby Schaumann of Lebanon, MO, and several nieces and nephews. Boyd's parents Carl DeWald and Kathryn E. (Stark) Schaumann along with three siblings Mary Delaney, Emma Ohl, and Carl Schaumann are predeceased.
