



Donald H. Patzwahl

June 4, 1928 - July 23, 2012

Donald H. Patzwahl, 84, of Greenport, passed away Monday, July 23, 2012 at Community Hospice at Columbia Memorial Hospital surrounded by his loving family.

Born in Hudson on June 4, 1928, he was the son of the late William and Kathryn (Buckley) Patzwahl.

Donald graduated from Hudson High School in 1946. He joined the US Navy and served two years aboard the USS Little Rock. Upon completion of his service to his country in 1948, he returned locally and worked for Hart's Express and later for Harder's Express. He was a 37 year member of Teamsters Local Union 294.

He was a life member of VFW Post 1314, a member of the American Legion Post 0001, a co-founder with Francis Keeler of the Greenport Senior Citizens Club, a life member of the Federation of Polish Sportsmen Club for 60 years, a member of St. Joseph's Church in Stottville, a member of the Greenport Fire Company #1 and also volunteered with the Greenport Fire Police. Donald served as a councilman on the Greenport Town Board for 20 years and recently served on the Greenport Planning Board. He was well-known for his wonderful "sense of humor".

In 1952 he married Marion Barto Patzwahl and settled in Greenport, where they lived the rest of his life and raised their family.

Donald is survived by his beloved wife of 60 years, Marion Patzwahl; his devoted children, Scott (Nancy) Patzwahl of Valatie, Laurie (Robert) Nicholson of Claverack, and Terry (August) Abatecola of Claverack, and eight loving grandchildren, Lucas Nicholson of East Greenbush, Nathan Nicholson of Claverack, August Abatecola, Jr. of Mt Kisco, Kyle Patzwahl of Valatie, Bryanna Abatecola of Athens, Ali Phillips of San Diego, Calif., and Taylor and Hannah Patzwahl, both of Valatie. Also surviving are his brother, William Patzwahl of Claverack, his great-granddaughter, Leah Nicholson of East Greenbush, and several nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his brother, Carroll Patzwahl.
