We were "Beatle buddies", huge fans of the Beatles, and we literally cried in our beers at the Rhinebeck Tavern the day after John Lennon was killed. Twelve years later when I came into a pair of tickets to see Paul McCartney at Giants Stadium through a radio station I was working at I immediately called Ed and invited him to go with me. It was a blast, and I was so happy to share that experience with him! Ed was a top notch drummer, as good as any of the pros, with a style that reminded me of Levon Helm (Eddie Beau was already good at 17, playing with Gary Splain and the Rockets, and then with his best friend Tommy Dawson-no slouch himself on the organ!- in the local group Train (not to be confused with the later famous group with that name) [and I loved the use of the strobe light when Train played!]). Ed became an accomplished guitarist later, even as he continued working at his day job as a carpenter (which he also was very good at). Carpentry was his trade but music was his passion. He was kind, witty and loyal (and quite the dashing ladies' man in his youthful heyday!).
