Franklin "Frank" McPherson was called home on September 10, 2024, at Greene Meadow Nursing Home, where God peacefully ended his battle with Alzheimer's disease.

Born in St. Thomas, Jamaica, West Indies, to Vita (Telfer) Robinson and Simeon Fitzgerald McPherson, Frank came to America at a young age. He found work in the area's orchards, harvesting fruit alongside many others who came to rely on his steady presence.
