Wheaties married Martin "Marty" Kittell and had five children, which she would proudly tell people to, "You raise five kids...!". A well-regarded local artist, Wheaties found her love of painting, when she said she had to find something meaningful to do besides running around chasing five kids. She took classes and discovered her medium of pastels. She was extremely generous in giving away her paintings to others. When asked once, how she knew a particular person, she said "oh she was very nice to me, so I gave her a painting."

Wheaties also put her artistic talents to use as a florist, working at Rosery Florist during their busy seasons.

A fun loving mother, wife, and friend, Wheaties and Marty were part of a group of six neighborhood couples "the dirty dozen" who had a wonderful time throwing parties, going out, and doing things collectively with their families.

Wheaties possessed a deep faith, always behaving with grace, and great strength to life's challenges including the long illness and loss of her daughter Connie.

Wheaties and Marty enjoyed their later years with a winter condo in Stuart Florida, Wheaties had great fun and enjoyment organizing the parties and

shows at the clubhouse, doing all the flowers for the community, and sitting by the pool playing her favorite game Rummy Cube with her friends .

Wheaties lived the end of her life with joy and kindness despite having dementia. Everyone who met her or who was involved in her care would always comment “ she is so sweet”. Wheaties lived her life always doing small things for others with great love. Wheaties didn’t want a lot of fanfare when she passed. She wanted it to be simple; to be like “Goodnight Irene”.
