



John "Jack" Curry

January 18, 1932 - March 29, 2021

John F. (Jack) Curry, Sr. 89, passed away peacefully on Monday, March 29, 2021 at the Hospice Inn at St. Peter's Hospital in Albany, NY.

Born in the Bronx, NY in 1932, Jack was the son of the late George J. and Mary Fraser Curry. He was pre-deceased by his beloved wife Mary A. (Gormley) and his two brothers, George J. Curry, Jr. and Ronald J. Curry. A devoted father and grandfather, Jack is survived by his six children John (Judith) Curry Jr., Mary Alice Curry, Joseph Curry, all of Troy, NY, Thomas (Joyce) Curry of Albany, NY, Eileen (Kevin) Kendall of South Brunswick, NJ, and Daniel (Stephanie) Curry of Valatie, NY and his eight grandchildren, Mary Ellen, Patrick, Darcy, and Katie Kendall and Colleen, Daniel Jr., Erin, and Liam Curry. 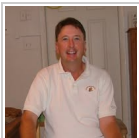
