



John D. Weinman

June 30, 1928 - January 25, 2015

John D. Weinman, 86, a nearly life-long resident of the Hudson area, passed away peacefully on January 25, 2015 after a short period of declining health.

Born and raised in Hudson, John graduated from St. Mary's Academy in 1947 and St. Michael's College in Vermont in 1951. He joined the Register Star as Circulation Manager in 1954; he became the Editor and General Manager in 1958 and then Vice-President of both the Register Star and the Chatham Courier in 1969. John was an active member of the New York State Publishers Association, and was involved with the Hudson Rotary Club, SPOUT, and many other civic activities in and around Hudson. John was proud to have received the Silver Beaver Award from the Boy Scouts of America for distinguished service to the local council. After leaving the Register Star in 1980 John embarked on a multi-faceted career including working for newspapers in Greene, Dutchess, and Orange Counties and later marketing for premium outlet malls, first with Woodbury Common in Central Valley, NY and later with malls in Wilmington, DE and Santee, SC. In retirement John was a volunteer with Hospice in Wilmington, then returned to Columbia County and became a volunteer with The Community Hospice in Catskill for over 10 years. Finally, John received the Life Long Learning Award from Columbia-Greene Community College in 2011 in recognition of his "outstanding dedication to life long learning".

John is survived by his children and their families: Jonathan Weinman and his wife, Hope of Marshfield, MA; David Weinman and his wife Stacy of Westfield, NJ and their children Jake, Rachel, Ben, and Matthew; Pamela Weinman of Glenmont NY; and Kristina Flathers and her husband Christopher of Wilmington, DE and their children Henry and Kathryn. He is also survived by his sister-in-law Shirley Carr, and by many nieces and nephews and their families.

On Saturday, February 28 visiting hours with John's children will begin at 11am followed by a Memorial Service at 12:30pm, all held at Bates and Anderson Funeral Home, 110 Green St., Hudson.
