Judith M. Marotta, 77, of Hudson, passed away peacefully on Sunday, March 13, 2011 at her residence.

Born Jan. 22, 1934 in Fort Kent, Maine, she was the daughter of the late Bernard and Verna (Larson) Michaud.

She graduated from Regis College in 1956.

Judith was the curator of the Hudson Valley Arts Center in Hudson. She was a charter member of the American Indian Museum in Washington, DC; a volunteer for many special needs groups; and a member and one of the original founders of the Hudson Antique Dealers Association. She was a member and Eucharist Minister at St. Mary's Church in Hudson, an organist at St. Joseph's Church in Malden Bridge for many years, an accomplished artist specializing in fiber work, and did "hands on" restorations for many buildings in Columbia County. Judith was also an avid equestrian.

Judith was the beloved mother of Andrew (Paris) Marotta of Virginia, Paul (Margaret) Marotta of Nashville, TN, Peter Marotta of Hudson, and Judith "Missy" (Dennis) Gawron of East Chatham, and devoted grandmother of Katie Lynn, Nicholas, Molly, Adam, Gracie, Drew, Thom, and Mari-Ellen.

She was predeceased by her husband, Michael J. Marotta, DDS.
