Her girlfriends at Hair We Are grew accustomed to her "surprises" of cookies and cupcakes, no family birthday was complete without a special dessert, and she became known as "the master of the cheesecake". To say she expressed her huge heart through baking and cooking for bake sales, charities and numerous community and church events would be an understatement. She loved random acts of kindness but never expected anything in return.

Aunt Madaline adored her family and was regarded as the family historian because of her incredible memory and knowledge of the "old days" in the town of Hudson. Loved and respected by all who knew her, she was generous and always positive and upbeat with a kind word for everyone. Her laughter was infectious, and her fondest memories were spent surrounded by her family just "being Aunt Madaline". A force of nature and goodness, she inspired her family in countless ways.
