Marjorie (Margy) attended deaf school in Manhattan, N.Y. and also the Rome School for the Deaf. There she met Carmen Pellicciotti whom she later married. They celebrated 58 years of marriage before he passed away in 2008. Margy worked at a sewing factory in Philmont N.Y. before her marriage and was a very talented seamstress. She utilized her superior sewing skills throughout her life to decorate her and her children's homes, make dolls and quilts, and to dress her daughters beautifully. She bred dogs as a girl, collected dolls, built fabulous doll houses, and also knew how to figure out a carpentry or building project, because she was so smart. She enjoyed a good card game, a steamy romance novel, and a cup of tea (no sugar please).

She was often underestimated because of her deafness but quickly those who got to know her were " put in their place" by her cleverness, gutsiness, bit of temper, unabashed honesty, and racy sense of humor. She is survived by her two daughters: Carmelita DeCicco, engaged to Paul Dietershagen and Tammy Barbour, married to William Barbour; four grandchildren: Brian and Nicoletta DeCicco, and Nathan and Bianca Barbour; nieces: Carole(Rick) Robbins, Bonnie Kraft and nephew Daniel Kraft.
