Reginald C. Grener, Jr., 84, of Hudson, passed away Saturday, June 4, 2011 at St. Peter's Hospital in Albany.

Born Aug. 12, 1926 in Mellenville, he was the son of the late Rose (Anderson) Grener and Reginald C. Grener, Sr.

He was employed in the maintenance department at the Hudson Correctional Facility until retiring.
