



Robert F. Rustick

September 5, 1944 - February 2, 2023

Robert “Bobby” Francis Rustick, born September 5, 1944, passed away February 2, 2023 at his home in West Ghent, at the age of 78. He was born and raised in Hudson, NY to Frank Rustick and Catherine “Kosh” Rustick (nee Popesckie). He also had an older brother, James “Jimmy” Rustick, who passed in 1974.

Bobby graduated Hudson High School in 1962. While attending Hudson High, he played football on both the defensive and offensive sides of the ball; referred to in the Hudson High School year-book, as a “fearless guard” and a “swell guy” by many of his classmates. After graduating high school, Bobby joined the United States Air Force where he served his country honorably during the Vietnam War for two tours of duty. In the Air Force, Bobby served as a Crew Chief on the F-100 Super Sabre, rising to the rank of Technical Sergeant.

After serving in the Air Force, Bobby worked as a union carpenter, then for ConRail, ultimately working with the United States Postal Service for the remainder of his working days. During this time, Bobby also enlisted in the Air National Guard and once again honorably served his country as a member of the 109th Airlift Wing of the New York State Air National Guard out of Schenectady, NY. Bobby regularly flew on missions to service the Distant Early Warning (DEW Line) radar sites in Greenland on the polar ice cap.

In his retirement years, Bobby traveled extensively, making life-long friends along the way. He was a part of various organizations, including the German Shepherd Rescue of New England. He took many classes after his retirement, including meditation, dream study, Reiki, and was continually interested in pursuing a higher knowledge of spiritual practices.

Bobby always had a smile on his face and he was quick to put a smile on the faces of others, often with a joke or a wild story from his youth in Hudson. He was a New York Giants fan and could be found watching the ball game on Sundays during football season. Bobby was also an avid hunter and fisherman.

Bobby was a loving father to his four children. He was pre-deceased by Karen Rustick (d. 2012), and is survived by John Rustick of Delmar, NY Joseph Rustick and his wife Erin Russell and their son Henry Rustick of Washington D.C., Nellie Rustick Meier and her husband Matthew Meier of Chatham, NY and two grandchildren, Sydney Boles of Boston Mass, and Henry Rustick (born to Joseph and Erin).
