Robert "Bob" B. Windhorst, 90, of Greenport, passed away Thursday, November 26, 2015 at Columbia Memorial Hospital.

Bob was born on November 13, 1925 in Brooklyn to the late Henry and Anna Windhorst. He served in the US Navy as a 6th Division Gunners Mate 3rd Class aboard the USS New Jersey during World War II. Bob was an owner/partner of Bob's Service Center in Craryville and drove bus for the Taconic Hills Central School District for 33 years. He was a former owner of the Holiday House Motel in Hillsdale, AUD'S Western Store in Hillsdale, and worked for the Long Island Lighting Company. He was a member of CADBY-SHUTTS VFW and an instructor for the Hicksville Police Boys Club Nautical Cadets.

Surviving are his son, Robert (Lynn) Windhorst, two grandsons, Robert (Stephanie) Windhorst, Jr. and Anthony Windhorst, his great-grandson, Jameson, and his sister, Jean (Ed) Borgnaes.

In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his wife, Audrey Windhorst, and two brothers, Ray and Hank.
