Died peacefully at home on March 3, 2018 at the age of 87. He is survived by his beloved wife of 57 years, Gertrude "Trudy" Whitbeck Leggieri, son John (Rebecca) and grandchildren, Olivia and Gabriel, and several nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by his daughter Susan, parents, Antonio and Adelgesia Leggieri, and his five siblings, Margaret, Celeste, Katherine, Gerald, and Maria.

Born on August 9, 1930, Rudy grew up in Hudson, NY and graduated from Hudson High School in 1948. As a young man, he played the drums in several local dance bands who performed across the region. He enlisted in the United States Navy in 1950 and for the next four years served on six carriers, USS Midway, USS Coral Sea, USS Tarawa, USS Wasp, USS Hornet, and the USS Layte. Rudy spent the majority of his time in the Navy in the Mediterranean, in the vicinity of his parents' birthplace of Pescara, Italy. After returning home from the Navy, Rudy applied and was accepted to the University of Vermont to study Forestry. However, what was intended to be a summer job turned into a lifetime of dedication to the New York State Troopers. He served the citizens of New York as a Trooper with Troop G and then rose through the ranks to retire after 32 years as a Senior Investigator in charge of The Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) in Claverack. His love of helping people,

investigative work, and the camaraderie of his fellow troops made work a calling. After retiring from the NYS Troopers, he was a private investigator, where he was able to continue to contribute his investigative skills to right wrongs. Eventually, he retired fully to spend his days with the love of his life, Trudy, and being a family man, visiting his grandchildren even if it meant driving through a blizzard across the country to see them. He also enjoyed gardening and hunting excursions with his son. Above all else, he loved his family and home. He will be deeply missed by his family and friends. The viewing will be held on Thursday, March 8, 2018 from 10:00 to 12:00 am with services to follow at Bates and Anderson Funeral Home, Hudson, NY.
