Wayne G. Weber, born August 27, 1936, in Pottsville, Pennsylvania, to Charles W. Weber and Florence Hulet Weber, passed away peacefully on April 11, 2026, leaving behind a legacy of dedication, service, and quiet strength.

Wayne proudly served his country in the United States Air Force and continued his commitment through 28 years in the Air Force Reserve, retiring with the rank of Master Sergeant. His military service reflected his deep sense of duty, discipline, and patriotism to God and Country.

He attended his beloved Penn State, where he earned his degree in education, and later received a graduate degree from SUNY Cortland. Wayne dedicated his professional life to education as an elementary school teacher in the Hudson School District. Over the course of his career, he touched the lives of countless students, guiding them with patience, kindness, and a genuine passion for learning. He retired in 1996 after many years of devoted service. Following his retirement, Wayne continued his life's passion for teaching by working with the migrant education program, where he remained committed to helping students succeed and thrive.

Wayne was an active member of his community, participating in the American Legion, Kiwanis, and the Greenport Fire Company. He was also a devoted member of Christ Church, where he warmly welcomed others as a greeter at services, reflecting his kind and friendly nature.

A proud and lifelong supporter of Penn State, Wayne was a fervent fan of all

things Penn State—especially football—and he never missed an opportunity to enjoy the famous Creamery ice cream, peachy Paterno being his favorite. Wayne was predeceased by his beloved wife, Helen A. Woznieski Weber, who passed away on October 23, 2006. The two were married on August 18, 1968, sharing many years of love and companionship. He was also predeceased by his brothers, Charles and Harry.

Wayne is survived by his nephew, C.J. Weber, and his niece, Marie Weber, both of Pennsylvania.

Wayne was known for his steady presence, warm heart, and the quiet way he cared for others. He valued family, community, education, and service. His kindness and gentle spirit left a lasting impression on all who knew him. He will be deeply missed by his family, friends, former students, and all whose lives he touched. His legacy of service and compassion will live on in the many lives he influenced.
