William "Bill" Moore, 73, of Claverack, passed away on Saturday, April 20, 2019 at Pine Haven Nursing Home.

Born in Hudson on January 25, 1946, he was the late William B. Moore and Clarissa (Sagendorph) Moore. Bill graduated from Hudson High School, Dutchess Community College, and attended New York University. He was employed in the savings bank industry in New York City and Westchester County areas for 16 years, prior to joining the New York State Banking Department (later consolidates into the Department of Financial Services) in Albany as a bank examiner for eight years.
